Indigenous women beyond beijing +10

Convinced of the commitments assumed in the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), the Beijing Platform for Action, the Millennium Development Goals, the Durban Plan of Action the General Assembly Resolution on the Second International Decade of Indigenous Peoples of the World, to guarantee the economic, social and cultural well-being of women,

Recognizing that indigenous Women are part of the diversity of the women of the world,

Reaffirming the recommendations on Indigenous Women and girls of the third session of the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues that emphasized equality, non-discrimination and the recognition of the Value of the diversity of their own cultural identities and forms of social organization,

Recognizing also that profound gaps exist between Indigenous Women and other groups that will affect the achievement of the Objectives of the Millennium Developments Goals.

Recommends that Governments, Inter-governmental agencies, the private sector and civil society adopt measures that ensure the full and effective participation of Indigenous Women in the implementation, follow up work and monitoring of the Beijing Platform for Action and Millennium Development Goals.
